We have established a database which consists of more than 1000 individuals who are in dire need for assistance. As we all know, this is just the number of those recorded and there is a possibility of more people who live in great destitute. Nonetheless, we have realized that as Council, we will not be able to reach out to all the individuals if we

are to do this on our own; therefore, we need to actively sought assistance from our stakeholders during this challenging time.

Honourable Councillors, Esteemed Management of the Municipality

Furthermore, I wish to share with you that the Municipality of Swakopmund acquired face masks and hand sanitizers to the value of N\$13,449.99 for the Swakopmund Namibian Police and Namibia Correctional Service in their efforts to support the frontline service providers during this COVID-19 pandemic in addition to their role of crime prevention and safeguarding of the community members of its town.

In recognition of this and as a means of Council's token of appreciation, a handover ceremony was held on Wednesday, the 22<sup>nd</sup> of July 2020 at the Municipality of Swakopmund's Council Chambers. The essential role played by our officers should not go unnoticed as they have also been at the forefront of fighting this pandemic and thus there is a vital need for protective equipment for the officers in order to ensure their own safety as well. The peace officers have shown great humanity as they risked their own lives in order to protect the lives of their fellow Namibians. Thus, we hope that this donation will make an impact in the safeguarding of the officers.

#### Ladies and gentlemen

Council wishes to reassure the community of Swakopmund of our commitment to provide quality service delivery to its community and we are immensely grateful for support rendered by the Namibian Police and Correctional Service towards the realization of this.

Honorable Councilors, Ladies and gentlemen,

I would like to take note of Council's effort as we are tirelessly working towards ensuring that we contributes towards the curbing and further spread of the Corona virus. I therefore wish to thank each one of you for your valuable contribution in this matter. I further wish to implore on the staff members and my fellow Councilors to continue working towards making a difference in the lives of our community members. As we may be aware, the current statistics states that the COVID-19 cases are standing at a total 1986. On a positive note we have recorded 104 recoveries. However, let us continue to stay safe and adhere to the necessary safety precautions.

#### Honourable Councillors, Ladies and gentlemen

On a rather sad note, I would also like to address the issue of the uncontrollable fire eruptions, which remain a high risk among our community as it causes great destruction to the livelihood of our people. The Municipality of Swakopmund's Firefighting division has recorded a number of 16 fire outbreaks since the beginning of this year. The mostly affected areas were recorded in the informal settlements in the DRC and Matutura community as well as Mondesa's informal structures. It was established that the recorded fire outbreaks were a result of open flame candles, outside fires, lamp burn outs and stoves being left on without any attendance. Furthermore, there are overloading of electrical appliances in the informal structures whereby owners illegally connect electricity cables and these causes in fire outbreaks.

The Office of the Mayor is currently coordinating all donations pertaining to the victims as we try by all means to assist those who are affected by the fire eruptions.

#### Honourable Councillors

In our efforts to mitigate the causes associated with fire accidents, the Health Services and Fire Brigade Departments hosted a fire safety awareness day. This event raised awareness about fire safety, the factors contributing to fire incidents and the measures to be taken during these emergencies. I would like to implore on the community to please remain vigilant when handling hazardous equipment which may result in this fire outbreaks.

#### Ladies and Gentlemen

Over the weekend, our close neigbour, Walvis Bay town, had witnessed yet another horrific incident as a result of a fire eruption. It has been reported that about 400 Ordinary Council Meeting: 30 July 2020

households burnt down in the Twaloloka community, leaving the affected families in great despair. The Disaster Risk management team through the Office of the Prime Minister as well as various stakeholders is working by all means to assist the families where possible. As I sympathize with the families, I would like to plead with our fellow residents to stand together and support our brothers and sisters during this challenging time that they are faced with.
